Financial support for students in the ITS Graduate Program is available through institutional and federal sources. Applicants are encouraged to explore all avenues available to them for financial support.

**INSTITUTIONAL FINANCIAL AID**

The ITS Program at Wake Forest University is committed to tailoring institutional financial support to a student's particular financial situation and curricular goals. Institutional financial awards are based upon a combination of available funding, student merit, and student financial need. Financial assistance is awarded on a rolling basis, so early application is highly encouraged.

All scholarships are awarded for a 1-year period for fall enrollees. Scholarship renewal depends upon available funds in subsequent years. Students who receive substantial tuition assistance from an employer or other source will be considered based only on any funds remaining after applications from unsupported students are considered.

All students seeking institutional financial support must

2. Complete the *Institutional Financial Support Application* form (below) and send it as an attachment to [pardypp@wfu.edu](mailto:pardypp@wfu.edu).
3. If you are a U.S. citizen, complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) and send to the Wake Forest University Office of Financial Aid [grad.financialaid.wfu.edu](http://grad.financialaid.wfu.edu).

Once all information is received, the Interpreting and Translation Studies Admissions Committee will review the material in conjunction with the Wake Forest University Office of Financial Aid and notify the applicant.

**FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID**

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is also required for students who are U.S. citizens seeking federal financial aid, though the process described above is for institutional (i.e. WFU) aid.
